

# 01 INTRODUCTION

The 2020 Joint Studio Towards a Resilient City (ITB) and Understanding Self-Help Housing (University of Sydney) is designed to broaden the knowledge in informal urbanism and concepts of urban resilience and self-help housing particularly for the most exposed and vulnerable urban populations. The studio is targeted for urban planners, architects, urban designers and decision makers who wish to work at international agencies and/or have interest on understanding urbanising cities in developing countries. The Joint Studio is an international collaboration of School of Architecture, Planning and Policy Development, Institut Teknologi Bandung with Sydney School of Architecture, Design and Planning, the University of Sydney, Australia, which has been carried out since 2015. The studio comprises lectures, fieldwork, studio, tutorials, group presentation and public exhibition at the University of Sydney.



#### THE 2020 JOINT STUDIO PROGRAMME BOOK





The unit reflects the increasing internationalisation of Australian and Indonesia planning practice in contributing to better managing urbanisation, especially within the Asia and Pacific Region. It caters to the needs of local and international students intending to work on urban and regional planning projects internationally and wishing to better understand how the city is made and shaped including understanding dimensions of urban complexity in the formal and informal city. The Joint Studio of School of Architecture, Planning and Policy Development-ITB and Sydney School of Architecture, Design and Planning-University of Sydney has received global recognition and was acclaimed as one among 150 World Urban Solutions by the UN Habitat in 2016.



- The studio comprises 2 blocks of compulsory meetings: Week 1, 27-28 March 2020 9-11 am and Week 2, 1-2 May 2020, 9 am to 12 pm Bandung time.
- Beside compulsory meetings, ITB students may join in Zoom lectures conducted by University of Sydney, every Friday after 28 March 2020 as indicated in the studio program.
- Lectures are delivered by international academics, researchers and policy makers
- All lectures and tutorials will be conducted online via Zoom and WA group organised by ITB and University of Sydney.



# 04 OUTPUTS

The studio of Towards Resilient City will produce an individual poster examining key themes of urban resilience in informal settlements, using a case study of Lebak Siliwangi, Bandung, Indonesia discussing following points:

- a. Understanding the Contexts:
  - 1. Geography: Indonesia, Bandung, Tamansari-Lebak Siliwangi.
  - 2. Demography: number of population, growth, structure, employment, etc.
  - 3. Governance: tiers of governance from central to RT levels.
  - 4. History and Development Progress in Tamansari and Lebak Siliwangi





- b. The Nature of Urban Resilience in Lebak Siliwangi:
  - 1. Determinants of Urban Resilience in informal settlements of Lebak Siliwangi (physical, social, economic, environmental, cultural?)
  - 2. Myriad mechanisms in building urban resilience in informal settlements of Lebak Siliwangi.
- c. What next? Implications on Planning Policy and Urban Design
  - 1. How to strengthen urban resilience in informal settlements of Lebak Siliwangi: planning and urban designs proposals.
  - 2. Contributions to the city: recommendations to develop urban resilience at a city level.

# 04 OUTPUTS (cont'd)

The studio of Understanding Self-Help Housing will produce a group work (PPTs and posters) examining key themes of urban resilience in informal settlements, using a case study of Lebak Siliwangi, Bandung, Indonesia, focusing on the following tasks:

- Understanding what the core concepts of self-organisation/self-organising cities and the concept of self-help/spontaneous housing - please define them!
- Understand context in Lebak Siliwangi (such as population, people, economy and livelihoods, location, land use history, governance, rules, regulations, and land use patterns).
- Identify the main morphological elements/units that comprise the urban fabric of the kampung.
- Identify block patterns thus, spatial patterns, forms/types, why block patterns vary (linear, grid and others).
- Identify alleyway types/hierarchy thus, spatial patterns and types why
  patterns vary.
- Identify the diverse housing (+ retail and other) typologies that shape the varying alleyways (specific examples, configuration and geometry measured, quantified). Use different criteria - such as setback, aligned, set forward (of what?), blank walls, scale - to identify change processes.
- Identify the small-scale building/design elements used in self-help housing

   for example, walls, steps, windows, doors, stairs, fences, overhangs?
   colours? style elements? and examples.
- Identify the incremental steps in self-help housing transformation/intensification by physical change type.
- What is the relationship between self-help housing, self-organisation and form and structure adaptation, such as street hawkers/alleyway width?





- What are the rules for self-help housing? What types are there? Relate
  to notions of public and private interest, evolution of housing/steps of
  adaptation, types of 'rules and protocols' at work shaping the kampung.
  How do these rules relate to public interest?
- What at the social and physical implications of self-organisation and self-help housing for kampung planning/design upgrading?
