Understanding the Self-Organised Cities in the Global South:

Planning and Design Adaptations during Covid-19 Pandemic



Aims and Objective

International Joint Studio provides essential knowledge and skill utilised by planners and designers to create, research, analyse, and preparing spatial plans and design projects. The studio is the place for students to expand their academic and professional skills and to enrich student's perspectives on different contexts of planning and design. Planning systems introduced and explored are those exercised in cities of developing countries including formal, informal, and hybrid mechanisms that evolving in an urban environment.

International Joint Studio is a regular event conducted by the Urban Regional Planning Program of SAPPD ITB since 2015 and has been recognised globally and receiving several international awards including World Urban Solutions by World Urban Campaign 2016 and Student Award Special Mention in ISOCARP World Congress 2020.

The main theme of International Joint Studio 2021 is Understanding the Self-Organised Cities in the Global South and will focus on planning and design adaptations related to Covid-19 pandemic including identifying the myriad interventions and modifications in housing, basic infrastructure, development management, local economy, transport, public space, and disaster mitigation. The case study is located in Bandung City, Indonesia by examining examples of both formal and informal settlements. The students are expected to comprehend broader perspectives of a city as it is in term of planning and design, demographics, social and economic attributes, environmental contexts, urban form and structure, as well as governance dynamics developed by different stakeholders in coping with daily needs during Covid-19 pandemic.

Teaching structure of the studio including lectures, studio work, and student presentations. Most of studio process will be conducted online due to restrictions of Covid-19 pandemic. Lecture sessions are including those by academics (ITB and partners), Bandung City Government and related stakeholders.

Themes and Sub-themes

Case Study: Bandung City, Indonesia

International Joint Studio 2021 is themed *Understanding the Self-Organised Cities in the Global South: Planning and Design Adaptations during Covid-19 Pandemic* and designed to embrace diversity in cohort and themes of planning and design. Students with backgrounds in urban and regional planning, architecture, landscape architecture, urban design, development studies, tourism planning, environmental engineering, civil engineering, and transport planning are encouraged to participate.

Students may choose one from the following sub-themes in relation to the Covid-19 pandemic:

- Housing Design Adaptation
- Planning Basic Infrastructure
- Changing Local Livelihoods
- Re-managing Urban Development
- Designing Adaptive Public Space
- Re-arranging Transport Systems
- Mitigating Pandemic Impacts







Studio Structure

International Joint Studio is equivalent to 2 credit points (14 sessions @100 mins, including student presentations) and conducted on 22 February-5 March 2021. All sessions are delivered in English.

The studio is structured as follows:

- Lectures by global academics, Bandung City Government and related stakeholders (8 sessions)
- Studio work (4 sessions)
- Group presentations (2 sessions)





Assessment

Studio participants are expected to obtain essential knowledge and skills in:


- Developing contexts of planning and design
- Analysing baseline data and thematic issues and problems
- Preparing plans and recommendations related to the studio themes

The final output of studio work comprising: **PPTs of group work** and **student presentations** that will be marked by an academic panel (speakers).

The assessment methods of this studio are as follows:

- For students taking PL 5205, the joint studio work will be part of the Analysis Report Assessment.
- For students from other programs, the assessment is advised by the program coordinators.
- The joint studio is equivalent to 2 credit points for students taking subjects with credit points.
