Field Basic medicine, clinical medicine, or life sciences closely related to medicine

Prize Each laureate receives a certificate of merit, medal, and a monetary award of 10 million yen.

Ceremony The award ceremony is scheduled to be held in November, 2011 at the School of Medicine,

Shinanomachi Campus, Keio University, Tokyo, Japan.

Eligibility Nominees must be currently active in their field of research, and be expected to make

future contributions to the field. The Keio Medical Science Prize is an international award.

Guidelines for Making a Nomination

Criteria

- -The nominee must have made a breakthrough in the fields of medicine and life sciences, or a related field.
- -The nominee must have made an outstanding contribution to basic and clinical medicine.

Selection

13 selection committee members and over 60 specialists from various fields, within and outside Keio University, will select laureates through a rigorous review process.

Eligibility: Nominees must be currently active in their field of research, and be expected to make future contributions to the field. The Keio Medical Science Prize is an international award.

Nomination

- It is possible to make more than one nomination, however, the nominees' research theme must be different.
- There is no limit to the number of nominations from an institution or organization, but only a small number will be accepted from an academy.
