To help prepare for the role of a future global leader and change-maker, all SI scholarship holders become members of the SI Network for Future Global Leaders. Together with other talented people from all around the world, members take part in a variety of events, exchange ideas and create networks beneficial both to career and personal development. When the scholarship holders return to their home countries they also become part of the SI Alumni Network.



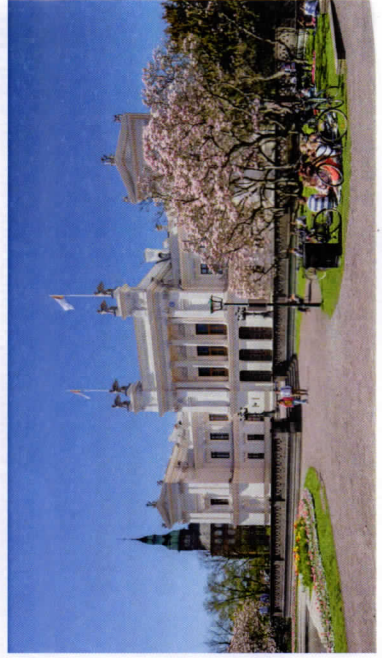
Scholarship application period

- December to early January: First application round.
- Late January: Successful candidates from the first application round will be notified.
- Early February: Second application round. Only successful candidates from the first application round can apply.

Develop leadership skills for a sustainable future

The Swedish Institute Study Scholarships (SISS) offer highly qualified students from countries on the OECD/DAC list a unique opportunity to pursue a master's degree in Sweden.

SISS is the Swedish government's international awards scheme for young talented professionals with creativity, curiosity and motivation who have expertise and show excellence in their working fields.

The Swedish Institute (SI) intends to build a strong global network consisting of talented people willing to contribute to and take an active role in the development of a sustainable future.

Scholarship benefits

Applicants are awarded a scholarship from SI for either a one- or two-year master's programme with start in the autumn semester. The scholarship covers:

- Tuition fees to the Swedish university
- Monthly stipend of SEK 9,000 for living expenses
- A one-time travel grant of SEK 15,000
- Swedish State Group Insurance and Personal Insurance
- Membership of the SI Network for Future Global Leaders (NFGL)
- Lifelong membership of the SI Sweden Alumni Network



Eligibility criteria

SI welcomes applicants regardless of age or religious beliefs and aims at diversity and gender equality among scholarship holders.

There are five formal conditions for scholarship applicants:

- Applicants must be admitted to a master's programme at a Swedish university that is eligible for the SI Study Scholarships. There are at least 500 eligible programmes.
- Applicants must have relevant work or internship experience.
- Applicants must be able to demonstrate leadership skills.
- Applicants must be an international fee payer from eligible countries and not have a dual citizenship from countries not listed on the OECD/DAC list.
- Applicants may not have previously lived for more than two years in Sweden, be currently enrolled in a master's programme at a Swedish university, or hold a degree from a Swedish university.

Eligible countries

The SI Study Scholarships programme is open to candidates from all countries on the OECD/DAC list, except countries included in other SI scholarship programmes for master's studies.
